

<p>ANGELUS July 30 - August 10</p> <p>A very large, beautiful golden peach that's similar to the old 'Elberta' but with some improvements. 'Elberta' often has a smack of astringency and bruise quite easily. 'Angelus' has great flavor with less astringency than 'Elberta', and 'Angelus' can be tree-ripened with minimal bruising. It's a very versatile variety that can be canned, frozen, dried or eaten fresh.</p>
<p>AUGUST FLAME August 15 - 30</p> <p>This is a new hybrid peach with excellent flavor. Speckled, blushed and streaked with red. Very smooth, almost fuzz less skin. Yellow freestone flesh is firm but melting, with a very rich peachy flavor. Maintains good acidity even when tree-ripened. Fine for fresh eating, canning and freezing. One of our very best late season peaches, often ripening in late August to early September.</p>
<p>AUTUMN FLAME September 15 – 25</p> <p>A Burchell introduction. An excellent late yellow peach. High quality, late season peach.</p>
<p>BABCOCK July 15 - 25</p> <p>'Babcock' is one of the earliest commercially grown white peach developed in California. It is an example of a low-acid, sweet peach. Medium-sized and round, with some blush. Ripe fruit is juicy, delicate, and bruise-prone.</p>
<p>BABY CRAWFORD July 25 - August 10</p> <p>We named this variety ourselves, and we were the first to grow it for the fresh market. In flavor, it is reminiscent of the old heirloom peach variety, the 'Crawford' peach. The 'Crawford' variety was known for its juicy texture and classically rich peach flavor. Our 'Baby Crawford' is even more intense in flavor than its namesake---a true poster child for fine fruit. These babies are a little small in size, with golden orange flesh and only a slight blush, but we believe it's the most flavorful of all yellow freestones. Our customers seem to agree. It's hands down the winner at many of our fruit tastings. Ordering this variety in advance is suggested because of its limited supply. It is excellent canned, dried or made into preserves, smoothies or sorbet. Ask for our easy Peaches and Cream Cobbler recipe.</p>
<p>BRITNEY LANE June 25 - July 5</p> <p>Very good flavor for its season. Very early. Large, well blushed, rich tasting, yellow peach with strong acidic peach flavor. Yellow flesh is often tinged red. Sugar-acidic flavor balance varies from year to year, according to the weather. A popular early peach.</p>
<p>CAL RED August 20 - 30</p> <p>'Cal Red' is a late ripening yellow freestone peach developed by the University of California, Davis. It is one of the finest flavored late peaches. Juicy with a</p>

<p>well-balanced, rich flavor.</p>
<p>CAMELITA July 10 - 20</p> <p>A beautiful white peach with a red blush. A freestone fruit, it's rich, juicy and sweet, with a well-balanced sweet/acidic flavor. A very good early white peach.</p>
<p>CLAYTON July 30 - August 10</p> <p>Popular peach at farm stands in the Carolinas. Excellent, old-fashioned peach flavor.</p>
<p>CROWN PRINCESS July 25 - August 5</p> <p>A new peach variety with extensive red blush. Ripens with 'Flavorcrest' and 'July Flame' just before 'Loring'. Firm flesh, very good flavor.</p>
<p>DIXON CLING July 25 - August 20</p> <p>This is probably the most flavorful cling and is often purchased by our customers who simply like eating it fresh out-of-hand. It has the firm cling-type texture but is also very juicy. Skin is blushed red, and there's a little red around the stone; it is also an excellent canner.</p>
<p>ERNIE'S CHOICE July 25 - August 10</p> <p>This peach was named after Ernie Christ, a New Jersey Agricultural Agent who first evaluated the variety. While the variety's name may sound a little "hokey", calling it 'Christ's Choice', it would certainly have sounded a bit presumptuous. Actually, Ernie proved to be quite prophetic in his assessment of the variety, and many who have since tasted his choice would attest to its flavor as being absolutely divine. In many ways, it is reminiscent of an apricot. At maturity, the fruit is a deep orange color. As it ripens and sweetens, it still retains some its acidity unlike many peaches whose flavor sometimes goes flat. This peach seems to just get richer and richer in flavor as it hangs on the tree; however, it does tend to soften quickly and is very delicate, much like a ripe 'Blenheim' apricot. Because it is relatively unproductive, we only grow a few of these choice peaches. Please inquire early for availability; it's often the subject of rationing.</p>
<p>FAIRTIME August 25 - 30</p> <p>'Fairtime' peach is an older variety. A yellow freestone that matures very late. Usually in the beginning of September in our climate. Fruits are often very large with only a little red blush. Flesh is melting and juicy with a very good flavor. One of the best tasting peaches for its time slot.</p>
<p>GALAXY July 15 – 20</p> <p>A USDA introduction. An improved form of the white saucer or donut peach. Excellent aroma and flavor, delicate texture. Sweet, juicy flesh.</p>
<p>GOLD DUST July 1 - 10</p> <p>'Gold Dust' is a high quality early peach. A yellow fleshed freestone with blushed golden skin. Superb,</p>

old-fashioned peach flavor.
HENRY II August 15 – 25 A clingstone fresh market peach. Harvests at the same time as ‘O’Henry’, but is sweeter in flavor and firmer in texture.
ITALIAN ICE July 15 - 31 The so-called ‘Italian Ice’ peach is sometimes called ‘Ghiaccio’ which means “ice” in Italian. Ours also include Korean examples of these pure white clingstone peaches. Very firm but juicy, amazingly sweet flesh. All white inside and out.
IVORY SAUCER July 25 - August 5 ‘Ivory Saucer’ is a white donut-type peach maturing after ‘Galaxy’. Same honey-like aroma and flavor. It was developed by Burchell Nursery.
JULY FLAME July 15 - 25 A new generation yellow peach. Large and firm but with a juicy texture. Excellent flavor.
JUNECREST June 20 – 30 Quality yellow freestone developed by Zaiger. A ‘Fayette’ peach crossed with a ‘Mexican’ clingstone. Semi-freestone flesh has high flavor. Deep colored skin has many speckles or “sugar spots”.
JUNE PRIDE July 5 - 25 ‘June Pride’ peach is a creation of Floyd Zaiger of Zaiger Genetics. It is still one of the very best tasting peaches from his family’s plant breeding program . Ripens in June in the Central Valley but reaches perfection in our coastal valley in mid-July. Juicy and intense flavor.
KAWEAH August 10 - 20 Pronounced KA-WEE-AH, a Native American name for a river near Sequoia National Park where the Kaweah tribe once lived. A very late yellow freestone, maturing along with or slightly after ‘O’Henry’. It’s a smallish fruit with high coloration and high flavor. Its rich flavor and juicy texture make ‘Kaweah’ a favorite of our customers when in season.
KIT DONNELL July 20 - August 5 Excellent mid-season yellow freestone. Medium to large usually with a nice blush. Developed by the Hybridizers’ Group of California Fare Fruit Growers. Named in honor of Kit Donnell, former chair of the CRFG’s Santa Clara Valley Chapter. The variety probably has ‘Baby Crawford’ as a parent. Excellent flavor and texture.
LAST CHANCE August 30 - September 5 As the name suggests, ‘Last Chance’ peach is one of the latest really good peaches of the season. Remarkable quality for such a late ripening peach, and is similar to ‘Elberta’ type peaches that ripen earlier in the season.
O’HENRY August 15 - 25

A ‘Grant Merrill’ introduction in 1968, but still one of the most popular late freestone peaches.
PALLAS July 25 - August 05 A modest, little greenish fruit with a pronounced beak. Also, referred to as the ‘Honeydew’ peach because of its rich honeydew melon-like flavor. The Pallas’s drab appearance belies its excellent dessert quality, varying from year to year. Melting, juicy flavor. One of the choicest varieties when well grown, but too often suffers from cracking and a merciless pre-harvest drop. It must sometimes be harvested immature and left to sit until it softens. Not a viable commercial variety, but listed here as one of the finest ‘Mi Tao’, or Chinese honey-type peaches.
PEACOT August 10 – 20 Not a peach/apricot hybrid but a peach variety introduced by Armstrong Nurseries. Late season, yellow-freestone, with an unusual flavor profile reminiscent of apricots.
PINK HALO August 1 - 10 Developed by Burchell Nursery. A large donut-type peach maturing after ‘Galaxy’. The sweet, aromatic flesh is often tinged pink.
QUEENCREST June 20 - 30 A small but choice early peach. A little golden orb blushed red. Sweet clingstone, yellow flesh for those needing an early “Peach Fix”, it makes an excellent first-of-the-season variety. Quantities limited.
REDTOP July 10 - 25 Beautiful and large, yellow freestone with an attractive red blush, often with many “sugar specks”. It ripens early and is the first of the fine yellow peaches, we recommend for canning and freezing.
RICH LADY July 15 - 25 ‘Rich Lady’ is another early yellow semi-clingstone. Highly colored skin and flesh. It has firm but juicy texture, and rich flavor.
RIO OSO GEM August 10 - 20 This is a very old variety and a peach with character; not cosmetically perfect , with goitered sutures and an occasional huge bulging wart, but many older folks remember and love this old favorite, warts and all. It was the first freestone peach recognized to possess firm, non-browning flesh, suitable for freezing and having what has been termed a distinctive “orange” flavor. An old favorite among many peach lovers. Limited quantities.
SANTA BARBARA July 15 - 25 The ‘Santa Barbara’ peach is an old-style ‘Elberta’ type peach, with soft melting texture, and juicy tasty aromatic flesh. Much improved over ‘Elberta’, and great for canning, pies, etc.

<p>SCARLET HALO August 10 – 15 A Burchell introduction. Yellow clingstone, donut-type peach. Rich, juicy clingstone flavor. Outstanding.</p>
<p>SIERRA BLANCA August 1 - 15 A very high quality white freestone peach, with excellent flavor balance of sweetness and acidity. One of the best late white peaches.</p>
<p>SIERRA RICH July 10 - 25 A new yellow peach variety from Zaiger Genetics. Very large, yellow clingstone peach, with very good flavor. Harvests in early midseason. Interior flesh is sometimes streaked with red.</p>
<p>SILVER LOGAN July 25 - August 5 A superb white peach that often grows to enormous size. A real stunner; beautiful creamy white and blushed crimson, and it's as good to eat as it is to look at. It has a melting texture and a luscious well-balanced flavor, with an almost intoxicating honey-like aroma. Probably the finest white peach we grow and a longtime favorite at our fruit store.</p>
<p>SNOW FLAME 30 August 25 - 30 Freestone peach developed by Burchell. White with a cream or ivory cast. Very good eating quality.</p>
<p>SUMMER LADY July 20 - August 5 'Summer Lady' is a highly colored yellow freestone peach of excellent quality. Similar to the famous 'O'Henry' peach, but ripens a week to 10 days earlier.</p>
<p>SUMMER SWEET July 20 - 30 'Summer Sweet' follows 'Sugar Lady' in harvest season. They are both similar in flavor but 'Summer Sweet' may be a little richer in flavor, with a little more acid than 'Sugar Lady'. Very sweet flesh that still has a full-bodied flavor.</p>
<p>SUMMERSET August 10 - 15 'Summerset' peach is a very late maturing peach of very good quality. Very large, dense but juicy yellow flesh. Skin has very little blush. One of the best in its season.</p>
<p>SUNCREST July 20 - August 5 The 'Suncrest' peach was made famous by David (Mas) Matsumoto's book, "<i>Epitaph for a Peach</i>", where he refers to it as the last of the truly juicy peaches. It's an old-fashioned yellow freestone which has a fine flavor, and juicy texture when ripe. It's excellent for all uses. It's a great canner, but sometimes it's not a perfect freestone until it is fully ripe.</p>
<p>SWEET CAP July 25 – August 5 'Sweet Cap' peach is a white donu- type developed in France. Very large, with thick shoulders. It ripens 2 weeks after 'Galaxy', extending the season for white donut peaches. Sweet melting flesh and</p>

<p>honey-like aroma similar to 'Galaxy'.</p>
<p>TANGO July 20 - August 5 Previously called 'Gold Dubloom'. This is a smallish, golden nimbus—a yellow flat peach with excellent flavor. Clingstone flesh is rich with abundant syrupy juice. "24 carat" quality. Also a great canner. Limited quantities</p>
<p>TEMPRANO June 20 - July 05 A new peach from Burchell Nursery. Early yellow peach, with an extensive dark crimson blush. The fruit is dense, juicy, sweet and flavorful. An excellent early peach.</p>
<p>TESORO July 10 - 15 Meaning "Treasure" in Spanish, this new variety was developed by the CRFG'S Hybridizers' Group. Early ripening between 'Gold Dust' and 'June Pride'. Shares its same juicy, melting texture and flavor of both.</p>
<p>TITIAN RED August 10 - 20 Introduced by CRFG'S Hybridizers' Group. Highly colored skin with red streaks in the flesh. High quality fruit, with excellent flavor.</p>
<p>WINBLO August 1 - 10 An old eastern peach grown in the Carolinas. Juicy, melting flesh with excellent flavor, but tends to soften quickly. Old-fashioned peach flavor.</p>
<p>ZEE LADY July 30 - August 10 A new hybrid peach, with a lot of red coloration on the skin and around the pit, which sometimes splits. Excellent, richly flavored flesh when fully ripe. Many customers call it their favorite tasting peach. Probably too much coloration for canning, but it is a superb freezing peach.</p>
